- 8 U.S. Representatives
- 134 State Representatives
- State Judicial Officers

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE?

You may vote if you are:

- at least 18 years of age
- a US citizen
- a Minnesota resident for at least 20 days before the election
- not a convicted felon without your civil rights
- not under guardianship of the person where you have not retained the right to vote
- not legally incompetent

TAKE THE FIRST STEP!

Register to vote.

Simply complete and mail a voter registration form. By completing a registration card ahead of time, all you have to do is go to your polling place on election day and sign in.

WHERE DO I VOTE?

You will vote close to your home or school. To find out where you should vote, call the Hennepin County Elections Division at (612) 348-5151 or visit www.cashenn.org.

WHEN IS THE ELECTION?

This year's primary is on September 14 and the general election is on November 2. Polling places are typically open from 7am to 8pm.

VOTE BY ABSENTEE BALLOT!

With absentee voting, you can vote either in person before election day, or by mail because of poor health, religious, or other reasons. Call your county auditor or city clerk for further details.
